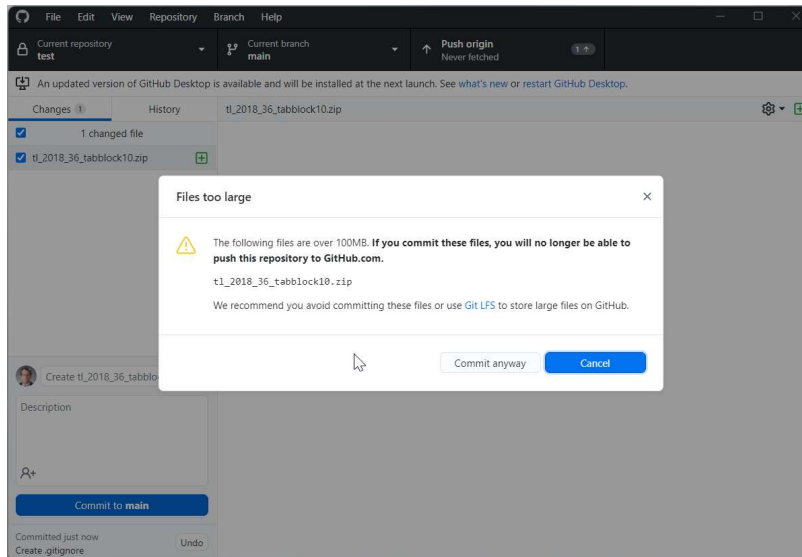


## C: Large binary files and GitHub

### GitHub is not ideal for large binary files

- Error message when committing a change with a large (>100 MB) file:



### Keep really large files out of repositories:

- Smallish binary files are OK: only worry about files > 50 MB or so
- Big files *rarely* need to be in repositories

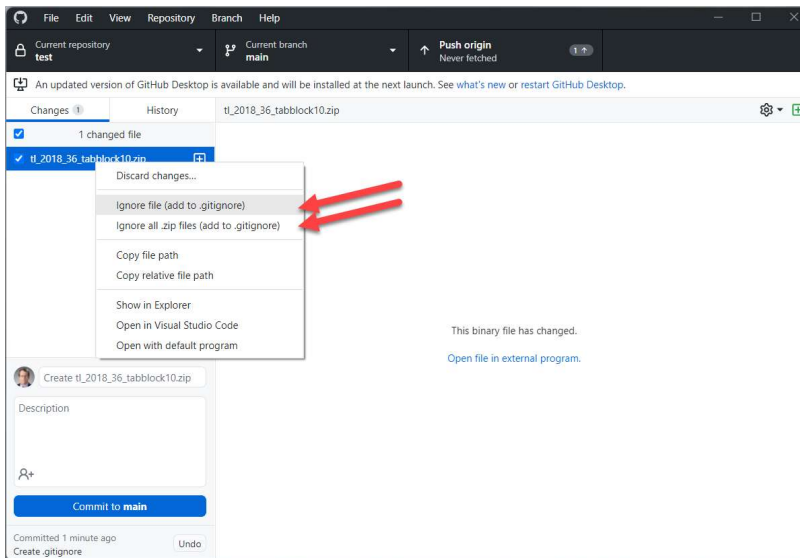
Input files: Can be downloaded

Big files your scripts create: Can be reconstructed

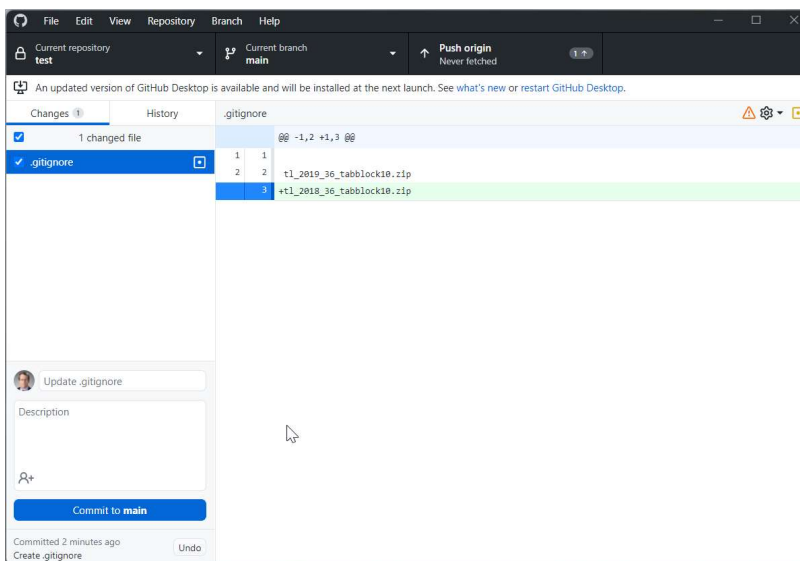
### How to exclude them:

- If the file has **never** been committed, keep it out via `.gitignore`

Right-click on the file name:



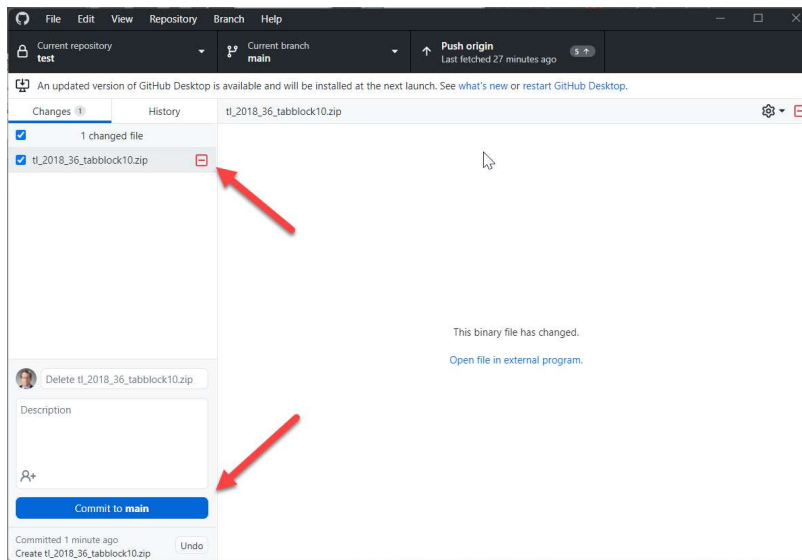
File is removed from the list of changes and .gitignore appears:



Commit that.

- If file **has been** committed before, delete it via Finder or Windows Explorer

GitHub Desktop will notice the file is gone:



Commit that, then recreate the file and add it to .gitignore as above
